Evan Chase will be the guest speaker and take questions from the audience after the film.



Story time with the Kingston Lion *All ages* Friday, December 8 at 10 am


Have a roaring good time with the Kingston Lion. We will have stories, songs, and lots of fun!

Bring your controller to be examined by library staff on the main level for this drop-in program. We can't guarantee a fix, but our methods often work.


Ghosts and Legends of Wood County Sunday, December 10 at 2 pm







Teens 12-16 can read December's book *Five Total Strangers* by Natalie D. Richards, then come to the library for a book discussion and, of course, pizza!


