

WINE CORK FLAG



Supply List:

- 35 Corks
- 3 Silver glitter foam stars
- Red, white & blue paint
- Paint brush
- 8.5 x 5.5 inch cardboard square
- Twine
- Hot glue gun & glue sticks OR craft glue

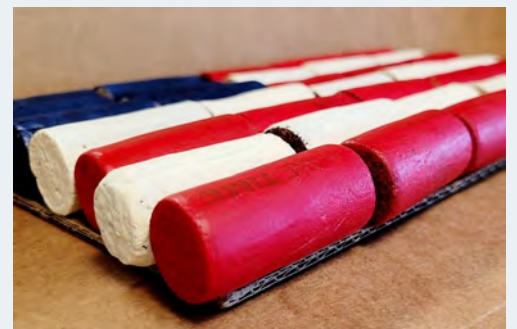
Such a cute, festive and easy project for your Fourth of July decor! And a great way to reuse those corks you've been saving!

Step One: Paint those corks! Not all of the ends will show so we found it easiest to paint completely around and dry standing on one end. You can paint one end or leave unpainted - your preference! You will need: (6) blue corks, (16) red and (13) white. Allow all to dry completely before moving to the next step.



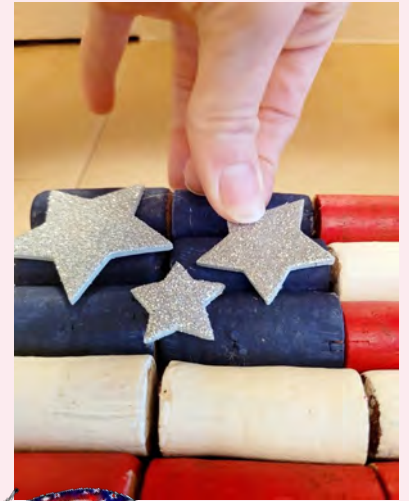
Step Two: Line up your corks into seven rows on the cardboard square to make sure that some of each cork will be touching the cardboard without any sides of the cardboard showing. The rows will go (from top to bottom):

- (2) blue + (3) red
- (2) blue + (3) white
- (2) blue + (3) red
- (5) white
- (5) red
- (5) white
- (5) red





Step Three: Gently pick up each cork and glue where touching the cardboard. Once secure, adhere the stars on the blue corks also.



Step Four: Once completely dry, flip over your flag and glue the twine ends on each side toward the top. You can trim the twine if you know which height you'll need, or leave longer and knot for flexibility. Allow to dry completely before hanging.
