


Code & Go Robot Mouse




Tim Kitson has been an English teacher at Perrysburg High School since 2011. He holds a Master's degree from Bowling Green State University.

Mammograms are covered by most health plans. For the best coverage, please verify that Mercy Health — St. Charles Hospital is an in-network provider with your insurance carrier.

Patient eligibility:

- Must be at least 40 years old
- At least 365 days since your last mammogram
- Cannot be pregnant or breastfeeding
- Should be able to easily walk up and down stairs and stand unassisted
- No history of breast issues, such as nipple discharge, lumps, pain or cancer in the last two years

You may be eligible for financial assistance if you have no insurance or have a high deductible. See if you qualify by calling the Mammography Assistance Program at 419-696-5839.

cancer awareness and sharing the Mobile Mammography Program with women in our community.


