

"Perrysburg Village Voices," New Local History Book Available From Way Library

#### **Pre-Orders Now Available**

The year 2016 will mark 200 years since the founding of Perrysburg and the coming bicentennial is being heralded with a new book.



Richard Baranowski, Way Library's Local History Librarian is releasing "Perrysburg Village Voices:

Hometown Stories of the Past." Subtitled "Celebrating Perrysburg's Bicentennial 1816-2016," the book contains 50 transcribed oral history interviews, many conducted at the library in his role as local history librarian. The book features a lively cross section of

Perrysburg city and township residents, many of whom are descendants of Perrysburg pioneer families. Enhancing the book are 175 photographs, some dating back to the mid-1800s.

The book will be officially released at this year's Harrison Rally Day in Perrysburg on September 12. Books will be available at the Rally Day street fair at the Way Library Foundation & Friends booth. The book will also be sold at the Way Library, the Perrysburg Messenger-Journal office and Kazmaier's Market. The price of this hardcover volume is \$25.00 plus \$5.00 for shipping and handling. It is available by mail-order from the Way Library Foundation & Friends. Book orders are now being accepted.

Richard Baranowski will be conducting a book talk on "Village Voices" at Way Library on <a href="Wednesday">Wednesday</a>, <a href="September 16">September 16</a> at 7:00 p.m. in the lower-level auditorium. Books will be available at the program.

This is a non-juried exhibition open to all honorably discharged veterans of any era or branch of service in any media or genre of visual or literary art, with intention on highlighting the talent and



artistic abilities of our veterans. Veterans have served our country with honor and sacrifice insuring our freedoms as a nation. The show is also open to entries from family members of veterans and/or deceased veterans. These entries may be a work that honors a veteran or a work that a veteran created. Literature that is a reflection on our reaction to an art work is encouraged. Content is at the discretion of the exhibitor but should be suitable for family audiences in a public setting.
