### WAY DESIGNATED A 'STAR LIBRARY' ONCE AGAIN

Way Library has been recognized by the Library Journal Index of Public Library Service as one of the top 20 libraries in the nation in its spending category (\$1-5 million). With annual expenditures of \$1.6 million, Way Library was ranked 19th and given a "Four Star" status in the results released November 15, 2009.

The new LJ Index, first released in February 2009, organizes data and ranks libraries into star tiers much like Michelin guides. The "second round" results just released are based on 2007 data.

In this latest ranking, 7,268 libraries were rated but only 258 earned "Star" status based on four per-capita service indicators: library visits, circulation, program attendance and public Internet computer uses. Way experienced a small decline in its standing but 84 libraries were added to the \$1-5 million expenditure category in this most recent survey.

At the lower end in the expenditure category, Way still fared well. "We are proud of our standing as one of the nation's top libraries," said Director Nancy J. Kelley.

### 2010: Lincoln talk, Underground Railroad programs

Way Library will take a "Journey on the Underground Railroad" this spring, thanks to a grant from the Library Services and Technology Act Choose to Read Program. On December 8, Way was chosen to receive support for programs on the Underground Railroad, including a visit/talk by Ann Hagedorn, author of "Beyond the River: The Untold Story of the Heroes of the Underground Railroad." More details will be in the next library newsletter.

Historic Perrysburg, Inc., and the library will mark the anniversary of Lincoln's birthday (Feb. 12), with a program on Thursday, February 11. Author Randy Buchman (photo



at right), Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Defiance College presently serving as Defiance city historian, will speak on "Lincoln's Ohio Connections."

### Way's Topical Tuesday Series

### 'The History and Challenges of Ohio's Charter Schools' set for Jan. 19

Representatives from the Lucas County Educational Service Center Office of Community Schools will be at the library on Tuesday, January 19, at 7 p.m. to present a program on charter schools.

Part of the library's Topical Tuesday Series, this event will feature information on the history of charter schools; past, present and future challenges, and the educational programs they offer as an alternative to traditional schools. Anyone who is baffled by the concept of community schools will be given the opportunity to ask questions about this relatively new educational option.

Representing the LC Educational Service Center Office of Community Schools, Ohio's largest charter school sponsor with 70 schools statewide, will be Executive Director James N. George; Educational Consultant Frank Stoy, and Director of Horizon Science Academy—Toledo Dr. Engin Blackstone.

In addition, staff members, students and parents from a local charter school will provide personal testimony regarding the impact their school has had on their lives. Refreshments will be served at this free event.

### LWVPA, Way to present emergency response center director Feb. 23

The Topical Tuesday lecture at 7 p.m. on February 23 will be a joint effort of Way Library and the League of Women Voters of the Perrysburg Area (LWVPA).

Michael Cornell, director of the Owens State Community College Center for Emergency Preparedness, will speak on "Chemical/Explosive Hazards in Northwest Ohio." Refreshments will be served at this event.

Mr. Cornell will give a brief overview of chemical hazards and simple steps to take in an emergency. He will share information on OCC's state-of-the-art Center for Emergency Preparedness, specifically designed to

assemble multi-disciplines and present realistic, hands-on training based on real-world scenarios.

Before coming to Owens, Mr. Cornell as Director of Emergency Services for the US Department of Defense, and, prior to that, director of Hospital Employee and Community Services for Walter Knox Memorial Hospital and Commander of the Idaho National Disaster Medical Assistance Team. He has conducted homeland security training. A critical care paramedic, he has more than 20 years experience as a special operations field medic and fire captain.

The "Green" Committee at Way Library is working hard to make sure the library is making decisions that have a positive impact on our environment.

- Did you know that every public computer station in the library is turned off at night? Shortly after closing they undergo an update immediately followed by an automated shut down. In the morning, a staff member turns them all on with the click of a button.
- ♦ For the second year, a brine solution will be applied to the parking lot when it becomes snowy or icy. Phosphate, which causes damage to cement, will no longer be used to melt the library entranceway this winter.
- Way's "paperless" drive continues. Paper overdue notices are no longer mailed out, saving the library nearly \$5,000 yearly in postage and other related costs.
