### **Changes to Book Shelving Coming**

Here at Way Library we are always looking for better ways to serve you and ensure that you have a positive library experience.

We realize that the Dewey Decimal System can be difficult to grasp, so we are going to make it easier for you!



This summer we will be arranging the nonfiction books into subject categories. We believe you will find it much easier to locate reading materials using words instead of numbers.

You may have already noticed our preparations for this project. New spine labels include a subject in bold print, such as "FOOD." The label will also include a Dewey number. This will make it easier to browse for books, first by general subject, then in more detail with the help of the Dewey number. The Children's Department has already changed to this system, and the response from you has been very enthusiastic. Once we have the adult nonfiction ready, we will let you know in a big way!

In other news, if you are a fan of Science Fiction, Fantasy, or Paranormal books, you will be pleased to know that we have begun separating these titles into their own area. You told us what you wanted, and we listened!
