Jerry Bannister Memorial Dedication

On September 9, 2014 Way Library proudly dedicated an outdoor recycling station and solar powered trash compactor in honor of Jerry Bannister. Jerry was a board member of the Way Public Library Foundation for 9 years and a friend of the library for decades.

His passion, energy and commitment were an invaluable

asset to the community. He will be greatly missed.

Jerry was an advocate for the environment, enthusiastically promoting recycling and conservation. He was a Board Member for the State of Ohio Recycling and Litter Prevention Advisory Council, Board Chairman for "Keep



Toledo/Lucas County Beautiful" (KT/LCB) and member of Perrysburg Litter Control.

Family and friends of Jerry's donated close to \$5,000 to the library in his honor. O-I donated an additional \$5,000 in tribute to his 37 year career with the company and his determined passion for the environment.

Richard Baranowski's Local History Information for October

Did you know that Perrysburg boasts a Civil War General? Patrick Slevin lived in Perrysburg from 1860 to 1869. He was an



attorney, Methodist minister, civic leader and politician, once running for U.S. Congressman from the northwest Ohio district. Slevin was also a gifted orator, temperance advocate and activist for the poor. He knew at least two Presidents. He was also a decorated soldier in the Civil War, advancing to the rank of Brevet Brigadier General.

His house still stands on the southwest corner of Front and Cherry Street. Take a look at it the next time you drive by now that you know the story of Perrysburg's Civil War general, Patrick Slevin.
